**Bishop Toby** Addressing the roots of extremist views in Bradford is one of the tasks now facing our bishop, Rt Revd Toby Howarth. He is to head the district's Stronger Communities Partnership Board. The Board is a partnership between strategic leaders, the voluntary, private and faith sectors and local people who live in Bradford. Its aim is to foster social harmony in education, employment and other areas - and also to work against negative radicalisation.

It will also work towards the council-backed vision of a district where people "Get Along, Get Involved, Get On and Feel Safe."

Bishop Toby, selected after an open invitation for applications and a rigorous interview process, will start his role this month.

Steve Hartley, Bradford Council Strategic Director of Place, said: "We had some great applications for the role. It's fantastic that people with real skills and depth of experience want to freely give their time to lead this important partnership. Bishop Toby has tremendous respect locally and nationally and will be a wonderful leader and facilitator as the Partnership looks to deliver its ambitious strategy."
