If you have never experienced the danger of battle, the loneliness of imprisonment, the agony of torture or the pangs of starvation, you are ahead of 500 million people in the world. If you can read this information, you are more blessed than over two billion people in the world who cannot read at all."

Liz's statistics contained a lot more words than numbers and I am sure a whole range of pictures came into our minds as we listened. Perhaps we reflected on the enormity of the problems and how little impact we could have.

The charities our churches have chosen to support all play their parts in different ways. We are continuing our tradition of focussing on the Church Mission Society during Lent. Our CMS partner Awais is working specifically with people who have fled from battle, torture and starvation.

You can contribute by supporting the Lent Lunch on March 24th and there will also be CMS boxes available in church throughout Lent.

Unusually we are including an event for the Leprosy Mission during this season in order to take advantage of the Government pledge to double donations at this time.
