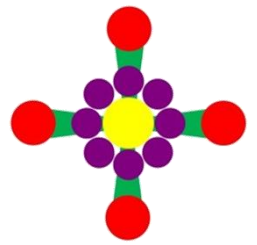

### The First Reading: **Genesis 17:1-7, 15-16**

When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the LORD appeared to Abram, and said to him, 'I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless. And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will make you exceedingly numerous.' Then Abram fell on his face; and God said to him, 'As for me, this is my covenant with you: You shall be the ancestor of a multitude of nations. No longer shall your name be Abram, but your name shall be Abraham; for I have made you the ancestor of a multitude of nations. I will make you exceedingly fruitful; and I will make nations of you, and kings shall come from you. I will establish my covenant between me and you, and your offspring after you throughout their generations, for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and to your offspring after you.

God said to Abraham, 'As for Sarai your wife, you shall not call her Sarai, but Sarah shall be her name. I will bless her, and moreover I will give you a son by her. I will bless her, and she shall give rise to nations; kings of peoples shall come from her.'

## The Gospel: **John 2:1-11**

Hear the good news of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John

Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels.'

## **Reflection from Suzy**

I am always amused by the NRSV version of Romans 4:19. Speaking of Abraham's faith, Saint Paul writes, "He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was already as good as dead (for he was about 100 years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah's womb." It amuses me because the Genesis story clearly says in Ch 17:17 "Then Abraham fell on his face and laughed and said to himself, 'Can a child be born to a man who is a hundred years old? Can Sarah who is ninety years old, bear a child?'" Abraham asks that Ishmael might live in God's sight and is assured by God that he will bless Ishmael, but that the covenant is to be established through Sarah's child, Isaac.

The promise that Sarah will bear a child is made to them again through one of the three strangers they offer hospitality and Sarah “laughed to herself.” She does not believe that a child is possible in her old age. The message of this story is contained in the short line in Genesis 18 verse 14 “Is anything too wonderful for the Lord?”

I don't really believe Christians who claim to never have a moment of doubt, but then I don't generally believe couples who claim to never have an argument either. I'm aware that other people are different, and maybe they do live with this great certainty. If so, I am envious. My journey is less constant and bumpier, but despite my doubts or worries my belief in God has been with me since I was a child. My faith is not as strong as I would like it to be – but I trust my life to God and, like Abraham, I hope that my devotion will be enough. That God will forgive my doubts along the way.

I heard a Bishop say, “I don't really like it when clergy say that they have been ‘called’ to a role because we invariably receive more than one person who feels they are called.” It struck me then and still strikes me now as an odd comment from a Bishop who has presumably answered God's call on his life. I do believe that God calls us and guides us. It is that belief that God is guiding my ministry that sustains me when things get tough. It is not easy to try to follow God's guidance in all that we do, every day of our lives. It is not easy to trust God to take care of practical problems and smooth the path before us.

Over time I have learnt to trust God. Time and experience have shown me that God's timing is not our timing. God promised Abraham, ‘I will make your offspring like the dust of the earth.’ Years later when Abraham complains that he is still childless the promise is repeated, “Look towards heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them.” Then he said to him, “So shall your descendants be”. And he believed the Lord and the Lord reckoned it to him as righteousness.’

Time passes and the story we read today is several years later and Sarah is still childless and old and they both laugh. God admonishes them and tells them the son will be born by that time next year. If we read the whole story from Genesis 11:27 through to chapter 25 we find that Abraham has many more children after Isaac is born. Their story is a journey of faith and trust. Each of us are called by God and given our own tasks to complete. We are given gifts and talents to use in service to the Lord. Some parts of the journey will be bumpy,

and some gifts are more obvious than others, but God is with us at every step and stage. I am fond of the Footprints poem and I can look back with a different perspective and see the times when the Lord has carried us through the most difficult times. When Abraham looked back and remembered how he laughed at nearly 100 to imagine a baby and then sees the children born to him at age 150, it must have amused him too. “Is anything too wonderful for the Lord?”

We thank you all for your love and support. We thank you all for your kindness and generosity both in practical terms and real gifts and in the sharing of ‘gifts and talents’ over the years. I thank all the people of faith in this benefice who have strengthened my faith and for the prayers and support through times of difficulty. I thank you for the lessons I have learnt in this benefice and the memories both joyful and sorrowful that we take with us. I thank you for your contributions to our leaving gifts of wonderful memories in a great book, the lovely planter and the cheque which I am truly overwhelmed by and deeply grateful for.

I was told today that the timing is terrible with all that we are all going through, and I can only agree. It is God’s timing though. If I tell you that the November lockdown was an answer to prayer, I would probably not be particularly popular, but for us that remains a key part of our journey. God works in mysterious ways and I believe that God sent me here, has blessed us in our ministry here and that now it is God’s will that we move to a new benefice and share with them the many things that our time spent here has taught us. We will miss all of you and the many good friends and great times we have had in this benefice. We hope to see you all again one day – out of lockdown – when we can party like its 2022! I am not overly optimistic about large parties this year....
